Slag Glass City—a Chicago-made journal of the urban-essay arts from the Publishing Institute of the DePaul University Department of English—celebrates and interrogates cities. Skylines are made of glass; cities are at once dense, cooperative, tense, tragic and hopeful; urban space is contested territory. The mission of the Slag Glass City is to use city literature and art to meld the old and the new, the accident and the plan, the rubble and the green, the rooftop and the prairie, the imaginative and the corporeal, the broken and the restored. We define the city as a built environment of any size with a metropolitan, cosmopolitan, or industrial/post-industrial atmosphere, or a municipality that exists in relationship to a city center. The work we publish features the city as container, the city as character, and the city as subject.

This 10th anniversary reading for the *Slag Glass City* will highlight essays and art selected from our archives by student editors, excerpts of work we've published and/or new city writing by authors writing about-and-from cities around the globe, including: Mumbai, Barbados, Houston, Manhattan, Charleston, Dubai, Ypsilanti, Paris, and Chicago.

This free in-person and virtual event will take place on May 1, 2024, 5:30-8:30 p.m. CDT, at DePaul University's Lincoln Park Campus, in Levan Center 100. The first 50 in-person attendees will receive a special commemorative key to the *Slag Glass City*. This celebration will be hosted by *Slag Glass City* editor Barrie Jean Borich, an award-winning author and professor of English at DePaul University in Chicago.
